River- a large, natural steam of flowing water. They can be found all over the world. Many cities are build near rivers due to mills, shops and factories needing water in the past.

Features of a river:

Source- the point at which a river starts. **Meander**- a bend in the river.

Mouth: where the river flows into the sea.

Tributary- a smaller river that flows into a larger river.

There are three stages of a river: **upper**, **middle and lower course**.



<u>Mountain</u>- an elevated portion of the Earth's crust.

Features of a mountain:

Summit- the top of the mountain.

Slope- the side of the mountain

Valley- is the dip between two

mountains
