Phonics




We are learning these graphemes and phonemes (GPC): **ear (ur), wr (r)**

Tricky word	Why is it tricky?	How to teach <i>Say: This is the tricky bit.</i> Then ...
<u>any</u>	The grapheme 'a' makes the sound e . <i>This is a rare GPC.</i>	Point to 'a'. Say: This grapheme says e.
ma <u>ny</u>	The grapheme 'a' makes the sound e . <i>This is a rare GPC.</i>	Point to 'a'. Say: This grapheme says e.
<u>your</u>	The trigraph 'our' makes the sound or and is not yet decodable.	Point to 'our'. Say: This trigraph says or.
throu <u>gh</u>	The grapheme 'ough' makes the sound oo (as in 'food'). <i>This is a rare GPC.</i>	Point to 'ough'. Say: This grapheme says oo.
fr <u>ie</u> nd	The digraph 'ie' makes the sound e . <i>This is a rare GPC.</i>	Point to 'ie'. Say: This digraph says e.
<u>two</u>	The grapheme 'wo' makes the sound oo (as in 'food'). <i>This is a rare GPC.</i>	Point to 'wo'. Say: This digraph says oo.
