## Phonics



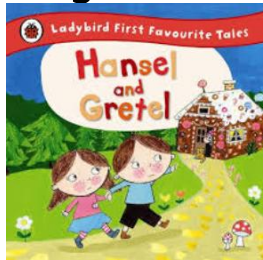
We are reviewing these graphemes and phonemes (GPC): **ph (f), wh (w)**

	Open your lips a little; put your teeth on your bottom lip and push the air out to make the sound <b>ffff ffff</b>	<b>ph</b>
	Pucker your lips and show your teeth; use your tongue as you say <b>jjj</b>	<b>g dge ge</b>

Grapheme	Catchphrase	Pronunciation phrase	Phase 5 Graphemes
<b>ee</b>	 sheep in a jeep	Smile with your lips apart and say <b>ee ee ee</b>	<b>ea</b> <b>e</b> <b>e-e</b> <b>ie</b> <b>y</b> <b>ey</b>

# Tricky word support

Tricky word	Why is it tricky?	How to teach <i>Say: This is the tricky bit.</i> Then ...
<u>o</u> nce	The grapheme 'o' makes the sounds <b>w-u</b> . <i>This is a rare GPC.</i>	Point to 'o'. <i>Say: This grapheme says wu.</i>
<u>l</u> augh	The word 'laugh' has two tricky parts: the digraph 'au' makes the sound <b>ar</b> or <b>a</b> (depending on regional pronunciation) and the digraph 'gh' makes the sound <b>f</b> . <i>*This is a rare GPC.</i>	Point to 'au'. <i>Say: This digraph says ar or</i> <i>This digraph says a.</i> Point to 'gh'. <i>Say: This digraph says f.</i>
bec <u>au</u> se	The digraph 'au' makes the sound <b>o</b> . <i>This is a rare GPC.</i>	Point to 'au'. <i>Say: This digraph says o.</i>
fr <u>ie</u> nd	The digraph 'ie' makes the sound <b>e</b> . <i>This is a rare GPC.</i>	Point to 'ie'. <i>Say: This digraph says e.</i>
<u>ou</u> r	The trigraph 'our' makes the sound <b>ow</b> followed by the schwa sound.	Point to 'our'. <i>Say: This trigraph says our.</i>
