Phonics



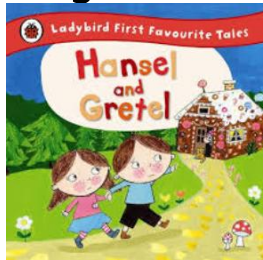
We are reviewing these graphemes and phonemes (GPC): **au (or), aw (or)**

Tricky word support

Tricky word	Why is it tricky?	How to teach Say: <i>This is the tricky bit.</i> Then ...
<u>were</u>	The trigraph 'ere' makes the sound ur . <i>This is a rare GPC.</i>	Point to 'ere'. Say: <i>This trigraph says ur.</i>
<u>where</u>	The trigraph 'ere' makes the sound air and is not yet decodable.	Point to 'ere'. Say: <i>This trigraph says air.</i>
<u>their</u>	The trigraph 'eir' makes the sound air . <i>This is a rare GPC.</i>	Point to 'eir'. Say: <i>This trigraph says air.</i>
<u>once</u>	The grapheme 'o' makes the sounds w-u . <i>This is a rare GPC.</i>	Point to 'o'. Say: <i>This grapheme says wu.</i>
