Tricky word support

Tricky word	Why is it tricky?	How to teach <i>Say: This is the tricky bit.</i> Then ...
<u>o</u> nce	The grapheme 'o' makes the sounds w-u . <i>This is a rare GPC.</i>	Point to 'o'. <i>Say: This grapheme says wu.</i>
<u>la</u> ugh	The word 'laugh' has two tricky parts: the digraph 'au' makes the sound ar or a (depending on regional pronunciation) and the digraph 'gh' makes the sound f . <i>*This is a rare GPC.</i>	Point to 'au'. <i>Say: This digraph says ar or This digraph says a.</i> Point to 'gh'. <i>Say: This digraph says f.</i>
<u>be</u> cause	The digraph 'au' makes the sound o . <i>This is a rare GPC.</i>	Point to 'au'. <i>Say: This digraph says o.</i>
<u>fr</u> ie <u>n</u> d	The digraph 'ie' makes the sound e . <i>This is a rare GPC.</i>	Point to 'ie'. <i>Say: This digraph says e.</i>
<u>ou</u> r	The trigraph 'our' makes the sound ow followed by the schwa sound.	Point to 'our'. <i>Say: This trigraph says our.</i>
